When walking in the countryside please remember that paths may be a little rough underfoot and on occasions muddy.

Please ensure that you have suitable footwear and clothing, and carry a bottle of water especially in warm weather.

Always close and fasten gates behind you. Please ensure that dogs are kept on a lead at all times.

Please stay on the signposted/way marked paths.


# Riverside Walk to Ford Village (Circular route returning via Hay Farm)

Distance: 3+ Miles
Grade: Moderate

Suggested donation for this leaflet 20p

Follow the directions below in conjunction with the map overleaf & the colour coded way-markers along the route (as shown above)

- A. Start/Finish at Heatherslaw Visitor Centre. Turn right out of the Centre and follow the road up the hill and through Heatherslaw Farm.
- B. At the wooden fingerpost opposite the farm cottages turn left into the field. Follow the waymarked path along the fence-line towards the river.
- C. Follow the path alongside/above the River Till.
- D. At the end of the fields go through the gate and turn left. Cross Ford Bridge then turn right and follow the roadside footpath up the hill.
- E. Turn left into Ford Castle entrance and follow the pedestrian signs to the village.
- F. Leave Ford by turning left at Jubilee Cottage and Horseshoe Forge, following the road down hill past the Estate Office.
- G. At the wooden fingerpost follow the waymarkers through the wood and round the fields to Hay Farm.
- H. Opposite Hay Farm Heavy Horse Centre follow the waymarkers straight down the hill, across a small bridge and up a slope (caution: this can be slippery). Turn left and follow the path to the wooden fingerpost.
- Carry on straight down the hill, cross the road and the iron bridge over the river to return to the Visitor Centre.
