- Memorial (1.8m/2.9km) and Lady Waterford Hall. Ford Village Shop serves food and refreshments. Continue through the village and at the top of road, opposite Jubilee Cottage, turn left passing Horseshoe Forge. Continue past the Estate Office.
- Just beyond a beech hedge, turn left at the fingerpost (2.1m/3.4km). Follow the waymarkers for a short distance through the wood. Enter the first field on the right. Follow the perimeter path to the left around the field up the slope to Hay Farm.
- General Opposite the main entrance to Hay Farm Heavy Horse Centre (2.7m/4.4km), turn right through a metal gate and, with the two large antennae and a big metal shed on your left, walk along the path down the hill. At the bottom of the slope, bear left through a gate, cross over a small bridge (3m/4.8km) and walk up a slope (can be slippery) between two copses. Turn left at the top of the slope and follow the path with the trees to your left.
- Keeping the wood to your left, follow the path down the hill, cross the **B6345** road and the footbridge to return to the **Visitor Centre** (3.7m/6km).
- Finish.





Heatherslaw to Ford Riverside Walk



Walking Route

Distance: Approx 4 m (6.4 km)

Grade: Moderate loop walk, returning via Hay Farm Heavy Horse Centre



Follow the directions below in conjunction with the map inside and the colour-coded waymarkers along the route.

- A Start at **Heatherslaw Visitor Centre**. Turn right out of the
 Centre and follow the road up the
 hill, past Heatherslaw Farm.
- B At the wooden fingerpost opposite the farm cottages, turn left into the field (0.3 m/0.5 km from the start). Follow the waymarked path along the fence line towards the river
- Continue alongside the River Till.
- D At the end of the path, go through the gate (1.1m/1.8km) and turn left to cross **Ford Bridge** and the **B6354**. Proceed through the gates with the rearing pit ponies on the gateposts.
- Walk up the slope, following the sign for Ford. Cross over the bridge and walk uphill with Ford Castle on your left and St Michael & All Angels church on your right. In the field on the right are the remains of the Parson's Tower, a medieval pele (pronounced "peel") tower that was once the home of the local clergyman. Beyond the front gates of Ford Castle, bear left and then right to follow the path flanked by conifers to the village.
