- © Cross a small footbridge (0.7m /1.1km) and continue on track. Please keep an eye on children in this area as at one point there is a steep slope to your right.
- Cross the second footbridge (0.8m/1.2km).
- **G** Follow the path, it will bear right sharply. Cross the third bridge.
- **(H)** Continue along the track until you come to the road, turn right.
- Walk past the children's playground (on your right). Continue up the road passing Horsehoe Forge (on your left).
- Take the first right turn, opposite Jubilee Cottage (circa 1.1m/1.7km) and walk back down the road into the village of Ford, past Ravn Clay Pottery towards Lady Waterford Hall (open daily, April to Nov). Turn left to where your walk began (1.15m/1.8km).


Ford Village and Castle Dene Walk



Walking Route No. 4

Circular route: 1.1 miles (1.7 km)

Grade: Easy loop walk with sloping paths, unsuitable for buggies. Can be wet in places.



Follow the directions below in conjunction with the map inside and the colour-coded waymarkers along the route.

- A Start at Lady Waterford Hall (please park in the designated parking spaces opposite Ford **Village Shop**). Walk towards Lady Waterford Hall and turn left towards the Waterford Memorial. Continue straight ahead, walking along the conifer lined path towards Ford Castle.
- **B** Turn left at the end of the path, walking towards the church, then bear right walking with Ford Castle on your right and St Michael & All Angels Church on your left. In the field on the left are the remains of the Parson's Tower a medieval pele (prounounced "peel") that was once the home of the local clergyman (0.3m/0.48km).
- Continue downhill and cross over the bridge. After the bridge the track narrows, keep walking and look for a track to the right signposted Woodland Walk to Ford village (0.4m/0.6km).
- Follow the track up the side of Grove Dene. This is a deep and narrow wooded valley and the path undulates up and down.
